



ACTIVITY PLAN – SESSION 6

Session	6
Theme	One Day International activity
Title	Cricket time line
Curriculum area	Numeracy

Where has this session come from...

In an introduction session the pupils learned about cricket terminology, this session uses that terminology to work on a time line to gain a feel for what happens during a cricket game.

Learning objectives

To be able to place events in chronological order.
To be able to calculate differences in times.

Room layout and preparation

Book a normal classroom with a Whiteboard. Then ideally move to a larger area.
Copies of the time line activity are provided with this lesson plan.

Starter activity

Mark out the times of a school day on a Whiteboard.
Ask the group for events that occur during a day i.e. Assembly, breaktime, lunchtime etc.
Place these events on the time line in their correct places.
Ask how much time there is between these events.

Main activity

Transfer, if possible, to a large area and mark out the times in a day again across the floor, using the events written down on paper.

Explain that journalists now can report on games in blog or tweet format.

Go through the events for a 'day of cricket' and ask the pupils to place them correctly on the time line.

These are the times from a fictitious Ashes game.

Now give the pupils the sheet with the times and events on and ask them to work out their own questions that involve a difference between two times - i.e. how long were the teams off for the rain break?

Opportunities for differentiation

There are two versions of the cricket time line blog entries. One using only the quarter hour time differences and the other using any time differences. Use which ever is best for your group, or use either as a differentiated task.

Where the session is leading...

The session gives the idea as to how long a cricket game lasts, so determination, concentration and fitness are part of playing cricket which will be developed in activities about healthy eating for cricket, scoring in cricket.

Assessment opportunities

Maths Ma2 Number, and mental maths skills.

Time	Order of play	Players Batting
9.05 am	Players from the English team arrive on the team bus	
9.17 am	Players from the Australian team arrive on the team bus	
9.54am	Australia starts training on the pitch	
10.30am	Umpires arrive on the pitch and ask for the captains, Alistair Cook and Michael Clarke	
10.38am	A coin is tossed and Australia win the toss and decide to bat	
10.55am	England take to the field, 2 Australian batters, Warner and Marsh, enter the field as well	
11.00am	The Umpires shout 'Play' for the first day of this 5 day Test Match	David Warner Shaun Marsh
11.22am	First Australian batter, Marsh, is out Australia 8 for 1 wicket	David Warner Steve Smith
12.01pm	Drinks are brought onto the field. Australia 52 for 1 wicket	
12.33pm	Australia pass 100 runs with a nice boundary shot, by Warner. Australia 103 for 1 wicket

Time	Order of play	Players Batting
12.45pm	England get another wicket, Smith is bowled by Anderson. Australia 121 for 2 wickets	David Warner Michael Clarke
1.00pm	Lunch Australia 128 for 2 wickets	
1.45pm	Teams emerge for the afternoon session	
2.30pm	Australia pass 150 Australia 151 for 2	
2.41pm	Australia lose another wicket, Clarke, is caught out	David Warner Shane Watson
2.45pm	Australian batter, Watson, out first ball Australia 162 for 4	David Warner Adam Voges
3.07pm	Australia pass 200 Australia 201 for 4	
3.10pm	Clouds gather and drizzle starts RAIN STOPS PLAY	
3.24pm	Rain stops and the ground staff dry the ground	
3.28pm	Teams back on the pitch Australia 203 for 4

Time	Order of play	Players Batting
3.45pm	TEA Australia 210 for 4	
4.00pm	Teams come back on the pitch ready for the evening session	
4.15pm	Another Australian wicket as Voges is caught out Australia 225 for 5	David Warner Brad Haddin
4.20pm	England fielder injured stopping a boundary, goes off the field	
4.37pm	England fielder returns to the field after treatment, seems OK	
4.56pm	Opening Australian batter, Warner, is dismissed for 89 Australia 262 for 6	Mitchell Johnson Brad Haddin
5.01pm	New batter, Johnson, is out after 3 balls with out scoring Australia 262 for 7	Brad Haddin Mitchell Starc
6.00pm	Expected end to the day's play, but due to the rain interruption there will be an extra 3 overs	
6.16pm	Last ball of the day, England get another wicket, Starc is bowled Australia 297 for 8	Brad Haddin Nathan Lyon
6.18pm	Players leave the pitch, back again tomorrow for day 2

Time	Order of play	Players Batting
9.00 am	Players from the English team arrive	
9.15 am	Players from the Australian team arrive on the team bus	
10.00am	Both teams train on the pitch	
10.30am	The Umpires arrive on the pitch with the captains, Charlotte Edwards, England, and Alex Blackwell, Australia	
10.45am	England wins the coin toss and decide to bat	
11.00am	Umpires shout 'Play' Heather Knight and Charlotte Edwards are batting for England	Heather Knight Charlotte Edwards
11.15am	Heather Knight is out, bowled scoring 2 England 2 for 1 wicket	Charlotte Edwards Sarah Taylor
11.30am	Sarah Taylor is then out quickly, bowled England 7 runs for 2 wickets	Charlotte Edwards Danielle Wyatt

11.45am	Danielle Wyatt out, England struggling England 28 for 3 wickets	Charlotte Edwards Lydia Greenway
12.30pm	Charlotte Edwards and Lydia Greenway doing nicely now England 93 for 3 wickets	
12.45pm	Charlotte Edwards gets a boundary to bring up 100 for England England 100 for 3 wickets	
1.00pm	Lunch England 116 for 3	
1.45pm	The teams come out for the afternoon session	
2.30pm	Lydia Greenway is out scoring 33 runs England 149 for 4 wickets	Charlotte Edwards Natalie Sciver
3.15pm	Natalie Sciver scores 20 quick runs, but then is caught out England 183 for 5	Charlotte Edwards Katherine Brunt
3.45pm	Charlotte Edwards and Katherine Brunt still in at Tea time England 196 for 5

6.00pm	Close of Play Charlotte Edwards on 134, Laura Marsh on 29, England 320 for 5
